National Eligibility Test

- Conducted by National Testing Agency, an autonomous body under Ministry of Education, Government of India
- Online MCQ exam
- Twice a year
- You can write from I MA onwards

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You can apply if you qualify these criteria

- For Unreserved candidates (including EWS) - minimum 55% marks in Master's Degree or equivalent exam from UGC recognized University.
- For OBC (Non-Creamy Layer)/SC/ST/PWD/Third Gender - 50% in Master's Degree.
- Students pursuing their Master's can apply but they must complete their degree within two years from the date of NET result with required percentage.

Age Limit

Validity

Age Limit for NET & JRF

- There is no upper age limit in applying for Assistant Professorship
- For JRF
 - For General male—Not more than 30 years as on 1st day of the month in which the exam is conducted.
 - However a relaxation of upto 5 years is provided to the candidates belonging to OBC (non-creamy layer)/SC/ST/PWD/Third Gender and to women aspirants. And also to the candidates who have served armed forces.

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Till when is NET / JRF valid?

- NET qualifying certificate has lifelong validity
- Validity of JRF award letter is three years from the date of issue or date of joining PhD, whichever is later.

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Visit ugcnet.nta.nic.in

- The exam is conducted twice a year, in June and December
- The notification comes two months before the exam. You can apply for JRF and assistant professorship or only for assistant professorship.

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Passing UGC NET

- It is the minimum eligibility condition for recruitment and appointment of assistant professors in universities/ colleges/institutions.
- JRF means you are eligible for a research fellowship of Rs. 31,000 per month which will be Rs. 35,000 in case of SRF.

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Two Papers

- Online MCQ Exam
- Includes Paper 1 and Paper 2
- 50 questions from Paper 1
- 100 questions from Paper 2
- Paper 1 is general paper
- Paper 2 is your subject paper
- All questions are compulsory; 2 marks each
- There is no negative marking
- Time - 3 Hours (One hour extra for PWD candidates)

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- Usually announced within a month.
- Candidate must appear in both the papers and must secure at least 40% aggregate marks in both the papers taken together for general category and 35% for reserved categories.
- Top 6% candidates are allowed for assistant professorship and top 3% are awarded with JRF.
